"YoseKi" Handicraft

The following Was taken from an article on Page 4 of

World of Wood Vol 60 No. 5. The article is by Chuck Holder

Recently a friend showed me a "magic box" that he had obtained

a few years ago when he was living and working in Japan. It was a small box in the "Yoseki" or "Yosegi" design and style—it appeared impossible to open—with hidden sliding panels imperceptibly "blended" into the overall finish of the six various surfaces. The one my friend has involves 14 separate moves to be discovered before the box can be opened.

Yoseki box-making magic has been taken to extreme levels with some of the more intricate boxes requiring many more moves before opening can be achieved. The makers exhibit and preserve a "Secret Box" which requires 125 separate actions to open it.

As a box maker, I am fascinated by the intricate craftwork involved and the delicate and colourful inlay work on the finished surfaces of these boxes. I did a little research work on this craft form for my own education and would like to share it with our readers in the following overview.



What is Yoseki

"Yoseki" is the sort of elaborate wood mosaic work treasured in Japan since the old days. The art form is reported to have been increasingly well received in other countries over the years.

The mosaic work is made by making best use of natural fine grains, textures and colours of the mostly native Japanese woods. "Yoseki" or Yosegi is the Japanese traditional handicraft of gluing rods of wood together into intricate patterns and shaving or sawing off cross sections. The name is

derived from 'yoseru', meaning, 'to bundle', and 'ki' meaning, 'wood'.
